

# Eyeliner Permanent Makeup Procedure After Care

## **Day 1** (Day of the procedure)

- Do not touch the eyes. Before bed, you can ice the eyes and protect the area with a clean cloth. Do not apply the ice directly to the skin.
- Do not wash the eyes, try to keep them dry.
- If the eyes are swollen, you may take an anti-inflammatory.

## **Day 2**

-The eyes may be swollen the next day after the procedure, it is a normal reaction, some clients swell more than others. The swelling should start going down during this day and the eyes will look better by the end of the second day. If the skin feels dry and you experience squeezing skin sensation, that is a sign the skin becomes dehydrated and you need to apply ointment.

## **Day 3-10**

-By day # 3 the skin usually feels pretty dry and you have to apply a very thin layer of Ointment, but don't apply too much because heavy ointment could cause the skin to not breathe or irritation and dermatitis. If any adverse reactions occur, stop applying the ointment and reach out to your artist and/or your doctor. Keep the area dry and keep applying the ointment as needed, so whenever you feel the skin is dry apply a thin layer and if the skin is not dry, do not apply. Hydrate the skin until all the scabs completely fall off, and it's recommended to hydrate the area for minimum of 2 weeks to allow the skin to regenerate faster. Wash your hands before applying the ointment.

**VERY IMPORTANT:** Until the scabs are gone, **AVOID** water on the tattooed area, makeup, excessive sweating, saunas, pools, or sunbathing. Do not PULL the scabs at all (you may cause scarring).

Do not apply anything besides the ointment you were given.

During 4 weeks after the procedure is best to not use creams that contain acids or ingredients that will lighten or exfoliate the skin.

A touch up is recommended in 6 weeks to add more color or make adjustments as needed. Please refrain using eyelash extensions for 4 weeks to assess if you'll need a Touch Up at 6 weeks or if you're able to wait longer.
